Innovation and Technical Excellence

- How does the project go beyond a routine or minimal-effort implementation in addressing cybersecurity challenges?
- To what extent does the project reflect forward-thinking design or the application of modern practices?
- Which cybersecurity frameworks or standards does the project align with? How does the project align?

Measurable Impact and Outcomes

- What specific outcomes has the project achieved?
- How are the project's results tracked, measured, or evidenced?
- What tangible improvements in security posture, risk reduction, or operational capability can be attributed to the project?
- How does this project represent a meaningful contribution to the Entity's cybersecurity posture, demonstrating novelty, innovation and a clear advancement beyond routine or standard implementations?

Strategic Alignment and Organisational Value

- How does the project connect to the Entity's broader strategic objectives and risk management approach?
- In what ways has the project delivered value to the organisation beyond its immediate cybersecurity function?
- How has the project contributed to strengthening leadership or organisational engagement with cybersecurity?

Contribution to the National Cybersecurity Ecosystem

- How has the project contributed to cybersecurity beyond the Entity's own operations? If the project is primarily internal, how does it set a good example that others could follow?
- What knowledge, insights, or resources from the project have been shared with the broader community, sector, or national bodies?
- How does the project support or align with the broader objectives of Malta's national cybersecurity landscape?

Additional Supporting Documentation

1. Endorsement

A signed endorsement from the Entity's Legal Representative (or equivalent authorised signatory), confirming the accuracy of the nomination and authorising the Entity's participation. The Legal Representative providing the endorsement must be a different individual from the Nominator. Nominations where the Legal Representative and the Nominator are the same person will not be accepted.

- 2. Evidence and supporting data demonstrating the project's impact, such as performance metrics, risk reduction outcomes, before-and-after comparisons, compliance improvements, or other measurable results aligned with the evaluation criteria set out in this document.*
- 3. Evidence demonstrating how the project contributed to strengthening cybersecurity at the organisational, sectoral, or national level, including alignment with recognised international frameworks and standards where applicable.*
- 4. Any additional supporting documentation, such as internal or published reports, case studies, articles, awareness materials, or visual content developed as part of the project.*
